

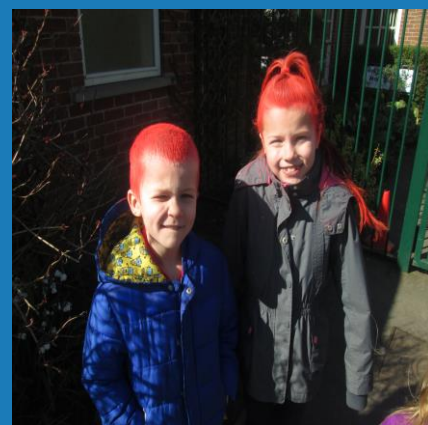

## Class 2



Is it that time already! In class 2 this week we have been doing lots of work on time, the children were a human clock, then we made our own clocks to help us realise the direction they tick and the number order. We have found out how the 'hands' of a clock are positioned for o'clock and half past the hour. Year 2 also looked at quarter past, quarter to and each 5 minute placing on the clock. The children were great reading given clocks and moving the minute hand on their own clock, but sometimes they forgot to move the hour hand on to show half past the hour! We have also sequenced things we do during the day and days of the week, thinking about the order and what came yesterday or what day it is tomorrow. Spelling the days of the week has proved a little tricky too!

In the afternoons we have been looking at healthy foods and those we should just eat a little bit of. Mrs Clark brought in some healthier buns with not much sugar and nobody could tell the difference! Whilst looking at food and relating back to our last topic we tried some space or astronaut ice cream! Finally, we designed our own healthy pizza with at least 3 vegetables or fruits on them and made them today.
