


Class 1

In class 3 this week In Computing we have explored how to use the broadcast block in Scratch to trigger another event, first looking at the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff and how we could set a basic sequence for them.

We also began to look at creating a looping quiz using this feature, where if a user got an answer incorrect, they would be taken to the start of a different section of the quiz.

In Art we have been creating mosaics, first looking at what a mosaic is then beginning to look at the properties of the composite shapes we could use before starting our very own mosaic.

In Geography we looked at the impact of the explosion at Chernobyl, using maps to plot the nuclear fallout and consider what caused certain countries to be more effected than others.

On Wednesday we had our transition day, in which Year 4 moved up to Class 4 to spend the day with Mr Brown, and Year 2 joined Year 3 for a day with Miss Shaw.
