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Primary School Sports Grant Impact and Evaluation Report Academic Year 2013/14

Context of Academy

Worlaby became an academy on 1st August 2012, sponsored by School Partnership Trust Academies(SPTA). This was a key strategy to improve standards. The Governing Body, staff and principal recognised the benefits academy status would bring. As an Academy, we now have the opportunity to use the freedom and flexibilities, to share best practice and work with others to bring about sustained improvement to schools within the Schools Partnership Trust, which has a supportive and collegiate approach, hence their logo, 'Together we are stronger.' The principal and staff are committed to driving forward improvement.

At its most recent Ofsted inspection in March 2013, the academy was judged to be 'requires improvement'.

The academy is a smaller than average sized school, catering for pupils in the primary age range (4-11 years) and there are currently 74 pupils on roll. The school serves the rural villages of Worlaby and Bonby. 51% of our children come from the village of Bonby where some are from a small housing association. There are three classes (F/1, 2/3/4 and 5/6).

At Worlaby we educate children from a range of social backgrounds. A minority of pupils are from families qualifying for family income support. Some pupils are from 'professional' homes who benefit from a high level of parental support. The number of pupils taking free school meals is 13.51%, which is below the national average. There are no looked after children and no pupils with English as an additional language. 2.70% of our children are of mixed race.

Our academy has a family atmosphere and relationships at all levels are good. Pupils behave well in classrooms, the playground and around the school. (OFSTED 2013)

Our pupils are encouraged to develop high self esteem and become confident, independent learners. Pupils readily accept responsibility and this develops their confidence. Great emphasis is placed on pupils making the best possible progress, as well as the focus on their personal, social and emotional development. Pupil voice is given high priority when decisions have to be made about the running of the school. We also welcome the views of other stakeholders e.g. parents, representatives from the community and governors. Pupils feel safe and enjoy our academy.

Worlaby offers a range of extra- curricular clubs to pupils including: Cross Country, Reading, Gardening, 'Wake Up Shake Up' and Running Clubs; the pupils in Years 5 and 6 also run a Handwriting, Photography and Mathematics Club at lunchtime.

There has a high percentage of staff changeover from March 2013 until September 2014: down to individual personal circumstances.

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Objectives of Primary School Sports Funding

Children to experience a variety of sports
Children are signposted to community provision in sports outside of school
To promote the provision of school sport
To develop stronger partnerships between other schools and key partners

- To increase the physical activity levels of all young people (**healthy lifestyle**)
- To enable more young people to take part in school sport above and beyond PE (**clubs, coaching and competition**)

Other Supporting Evidence of Impact

- Young ambassadors take their role seriously and are keen to help improve playtimes and assist with the organisation of events eg Sport relief mile for charity.
- The Get Going initiative (a free club) was attended by all 15 children who do not attend after school activities for support and all had a positive attitude towards this club- see newsletter article Dec 2013
- In Key stage two there are only 15 children who do not attend extra curricular clubs for sport when we are running them all.
- Parental support has increased, two parent volunteers help to run the running club, parents are more willing to transport children to events and show support at events.
- Street sport leaders have been in to promote the Tuesday and Thursday sessions in Brigg and Ferriby. Mrs Noble has worked alongside them and the council to obtain free transport to these sessions and we now have at least 5 regular attendees.
- The profile of sport has been raised and is now a regular item on newsletters.
- Staff feel more confident in their delivery of PE and have a structured curriculum to follow for the next two terms.

Implications for PSSG in 2013/14

- Subject leader is on maternity leave from March 2013, a designated member of staff needs to be assigned to fulfil the role and enable action points to be met.
- The curriculum in OAA, gym and dance still needs developing.
